ALABAMA SOLAR—RACHEL SMITH & KATIE WEAVER

Rachel Smith addressed those in attendance and stated that Katie will be the Community Relations Coordinator.

DEBRA FOLGER, RESIDENT

She understands NYSDOT is ultimately in charge of changes.
Ms. Folger stated that she had spoken with Courtney Gould at NYSDOT, and she was not pleased with the response.

Superintendent Shultz asked her what she would propose.
Ms. Folger suggested bigger signs or signs that say “Stop Ahead”

After some discussion on this intersection, Councilperson Glor asked if she would come back on either July 22 (rescheduled meeting) or August 12th.

ROBERT OSTRANDER—OAKFIELD BETTERMENT COMMITTEE

Stated that Betterment is working on Labor Day events.

Request for the Town to move cement filled drums for cords to be overhead.

Superintendent Schultz stated that the Highway Department will move the requested items by Thursday before the event. Mr. Ostrander commented that the roads aren't closed until Friday, which when he would like the barrels to be placed.

Superintendent Schultz stated that for years the Highway Department has been on four, ten-hour days and that the Town will not offer overtime for this event.

Mr. Ostrander stated that he was under the impression that the Board agreed to the Friday date at one time.

Superintendent Schultz politely stated that the Town does a lot of work for this event, however he will not ask his employees to give up their holiday.
