RESOLUTION 17-2026—ALABAMA SOLAR JOINT REPRESENTATION OF COUNCIL

Councilman D’Alba offered the following:

BE IT RESOLVED the Town of Oakfield will enter a contract with Benjamin E. Wisniewski, Esq., for the purpose of representing the Town of Oakfield with the Alabama Solar Project. The hourly rate shall be \$200.00 per hour.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town of Oakfield is a joint client with the County of Genesee, the Towns of Alabama and Batavia.

FOX HOLLOW DEVELOPMENT

Supervisor Reding reached out to Clark Patterson Lee, the town Engineers, for a proposal to update our current Land Development policy. The current policy was adopted in 1992 and needs to be brought up to date.

Deputy Highway Superintendent Muntz brought up the previously tabled Local Law regarding hiring outside the Town of Oakfield for appointed officials and MEOs. The Town Clerk will send last year’s minutes with the discussion from the previous board.
Deputy Muntz feels that this item needs to be looked at because we need to be prepared for the future.
